- * Where feasible, it is suggested that only one parent/guardian should accompany children to games. Furthermore, grandparents, aunts/uncles and other family members and supporters should remain home to assist in the prevention of community transmission.
- * For those attending games, please practice good hygiene, social distancing of 1.5 metres between individuals, and as quickly as possible, 'get in, play, and get out' so as avoid any unnecessary co-mingling.
- * All participants, including players, match officials and spectators, are excluded from football training and games if they have visited Victoria in the past 14 days
- * Players, team officials, parents/guardians and other club members must not attend training or games, if in the past 14 days they have been:

been unwell or had any flu-like symptoms, or

been in contact with a known or suspected case of COVID-19, or any sudden loss of smell or loss of taste, or

are at a high risk from a health perspective, including the elderly and with pre-existing medical heath conditions.
